I don't pretend to understand all that or know how to punctuate it. I am sure Russell will explain it when he gives his talk to the club. Following is Russell's bio from the Mountain Wave web site.

With more than 30 years of experience in a dual-track career focusing on public safety, high technology and communications, **Russ Gubele** began his career as a Paramedic and emergency medical dispatcher. While working as a Paramedic on Mt. Hood, he

was involved in several SAR missions, sparking his interest in SAR. Gubele held several management and training positions, as well as working as a Paramedic field training officer for many years. Later, he managed a 911 communications center, and was an advisor and beta tester for the Portland 800 communication system. He organized and instructed EMT, and First Responder classes at Portland Community College, The Portland Bureau of Emergency Communications, and several fire and emergency agencies. He was a state test evaluator for State Paramedic and EMT testing in Oregon. Gubele owned and operated a communications and electronics business in Clackamas, Oregon for several

years. He was involved in the development of the Mt. Hood Mountain Locator Unit Program several years ago, and is currently working on a new program using satellite tracking units. For the past few years, he has worked as an IT manager for American Medical Response. Gubele is a co-founder, President, and a Command Officer with Wave Mountain Emergency Communications SAR, a local volunteer SAR group. He also consults on matters of communications interoperability. and

He is a volunteer for the Clackamas County Emergency Operations Center, and EMS director for the Oregon Trail Rally. Gubele is a certified Paramedic, SAR worker, communications technician, emergency medical dispatcher, licensed amateur radio operator, ComL, and is certified in several levels of ICS. He also represents Mt. Wave at the Mount Hood SAR Council

Tower Saga Update

Many of you have been following K7BVT's ongoing tower story, and his love affair with the city of Portland. Chuck has provided us with a project update.

Tower Project

In 2012 I decided to get a permit to put up a new tower. Some of the guys at WVDX club steered me to forms on the city of Portland's web site that outlined a procedure for getting a permit for an amateur radio tower. Getting a permit requires passing through several the Zoning, Erosion Control, Life Safety, and Structural departments. Most were not familiar with ham towers and none had ever seen the amateur radio forms on the city's web site. The lady in Zoning thought there was a 35' height limit but was aghast when I showed her the exception in city codes that says there is no height limit for ham towers. The fellow in Life Safety had an uncle that was a ham said 'when all else fails there is ham radio'. The Structural department turned out to be the spoiler throwing up several barriers, the most insidious being the requirement to have a city approved company inspect US Tower's California manufacturing facility. I spent several months trying to come up with a practical solution to the special inspection problem when Jim K9JF put me together with Jeremy, NH6Z the new ARRL Volunteer Legal Consul. Jeremy sent a letter to the city for me and 5 days later I got a call saying my permit was ready, no US Tower inspection required. There have been a few technical problems, on my fourth rotator, but as I write the TH7-DX and 4 el 6M beams are assembled and hopefully ready to put on the tower. With luck I can give a final report at the September meeting. **Chuck, K7BVT**
